GENERAL SAILING INSTRUCTIONS FOR RACING AT GOUROCK

1 RULES

Races will be governed by the rules as defined in the Racing Rules of Sailing (RRS).

2 NOTICES AND AMENDMENTS

Any notices to competitors or amendments to these instructions will be posted on the Main Notice Board in the Clubhouse.

3 CLASSES AND CLASS SIGNALS

Classes, start times and class signals will be as per the relevant instructions for each event or series. The relevant section of the Sailing Instructions should be studied prior to any race.

Handicap Yacht Classes will be sailed under the Clyde Yacht Clubs Association (CYCA) Handicap system except on the day of the King George V Challenge Cup when an IRC handicap class will also be available.

Yachts racing in the Handicap Yachts Restricted Sail are not permitted to use spinnakers or other sails that do not meet the definition of a "headsail" in RRS 55.4. Only one headsail may be set except as permitted by RRS 55.1, or where the yachts declared rig has more than one headsail (e.g. a cutter).

4 HANDICAPS AND MEASUREMENT CERTIFICATES

All Handicap Yachts must have a valid CYCA Handicap issued individually to that yacht and its current owner. Yachts not having a Handicap should apply to the CYCA office. A temporary Handicap may be issued subject to payment of the appropriate fee and submission of the Application Form. This will remain in force, subject to review, until the Handicap Committee awards an appropriate Handicap. Handicap or Class Measurement Certificates may be required to be produced.

5 COURSES

Courses are specified in the instructions for each event or series. The number and letter of the course to be sailed will be displayed on the gantry on the Race Platform (between the Orange Pole at the east side of the Clubhouse and the east turret) and will be white on a black background. The Standard Course Tables for Etchells and Piper OD/Handicap Class will apply except where the relevant instructions specify an alternative. Unless stated otherwise, marks shown in capital letters will be **LEFT TO STARBOARD** and those in lower case will be **left to port.** All marks are rounding marks apart from marks Z (or z) and E (or e).

6 STARTING SYSTEM

RRS 26 will apply

7 SOUND & VISUAL SIGNALS

Visual signals will be displayed on the gantry to the west of the Orange Pole on the Race Platform. All sound signals will be by klaxon.

8 STARTING LINE

The Starting Line will be between the Orange Pole at the east side of the Clubhouse and an inflatable outer Mark 'Z' (or z) as indicated in the Standard Course Table. The moveable start mark Z will be laid in position 10 minutes before the first start. If the inflatable start mark Z has not been laid, then mark E (or e) will be deemed to be mark Z (or z) at the start. In addition, the **letter E** will be displayed with the course signal (Para 5, above) to draw attention to the change of start mark.

9 FINISHING LINE

The Finishing Line will be between the Orange Pole and Mark E (or e) as indicated by the final letter of each round.

10 LATE ARRIVAL

In accordance with RRS 42.3(i) any yacht arriving late in the vicinity of the Starting Line may remain under power or tow after the preparatory signal for her class provided that, after stopping her engine or casting off the tow, she carries out two full 360° turns on the pre-start side of the line or its extensions. While doing so, the yacht shall keep clear of any other yachts until she has completed her turns and is on a proper course.

11 PENALTIES FOR BREAKING RULES OF PART 2

In alteration to RRS 44 the penalty is reduced to a 360° turn.

12 LONE YACHT AT START

A yacht appearing at the start alone in her class will be given a race and the race for that class will be counted in that series.

13 KEEPING CLEAR OF YACHTS RACING

Yachts shall keep clear of the Starting Line when other classes are manoeuvring for their starts and after finishing shall ensure that yachts still racing are not hampered.

14 TIME LIMIT

RRS 35 is altered as follows: -

If at least one yacht in a Class has completed one or more rounds before the "Fixed Time Limit" then, where an "Extension" is specified for that class in the relevant instructions, the time limit will be extended for all other yachts in that Class by the specified time. If, under this provision, any yachts are considered by the Race Officer to be still racing at the 'Fixed Time Limit', two guns will be fired and the Class flags of those Classes eligible to continue racing, during the Extension', will be hoisted. If at the expiry of any Extension, yachts are still considered to be racing, then two guns will be fired and all flags lowered to indicate the cessation of racing.

If by the "Fixed Time Limit" no yacht in a class has finished but at least one yacht in the class has completed one or more rounds, then the results will be taken from the position of the yachts at the end of the last round completed by the leading yacht in the class, without regard to subsequent events.

If by the "Fixed Time Limit, no yacht in a Class has completed one round, then the race for that Class will be deemed to be abandoned.

15 POINTS SYSTEM

RRS Appendix A5 will apply using the "Low Point System". RRS Appendix A 5.3 will apply to all points' series (<u>not</u> Appendix A 5.2). Discards will apply as indicated in the relevant instructions for each event or series.

Skippers who miss a Points race due to being on platform duty will be awarded average points for the missed race.

16 SAFETY REGULATIONS AND INSURANCE

In addition to RRS 1.2, unless specified in a boats class rule all yachts shall carry an anchor and warp, a tow line, two flares (one smoke) and a bailing device each of which shall be of a type and size suitable for the purpose for which they are intended.

Each yacht shall carry adequate Third Party Insurance. The current recommendation is at least £3,000,000.

Competitors are also reminded of RRS 56.1 (Fog Signals and Lights) and should retire immediately if unable to comply.

17 PROTESTS

In alteration to RRS 61.3 protests shall be lodged with the Race Committee within 60 mins after the finish of the race and will be heard in the Clubhouse as soon as possible thereafter, or at another time by mutual agreement of the protest committee and parties involved.

18 CLYDEPORT OPERATIONS LIMITED (COL) RESTRICTIONS

NARROW CHANNELS Attention is drawn to the International Regulations for the Prevention of Collision at Sea, 1972. Particular notice should be taken of Rule 9b which states 'a vessel of less than 20 metres in length or a sailing vessel shall not impede the passage of a vessel which can safely navigate only within a 'Narrow Channel or Fairway'. The Course Chart and Key to Racing Marks shows the 'Recommended Channels' marked as dotted lines. Whilst racing or on passage in the Firth of Clyde north of Cumbrae Head, yachts must regard any such 'Recommended Channels' as a 'Narrow Channel' within the meaning of the IRPCS 9b.

Peelports (Clydeport) Operations Limited has also decreed that any waters of the Firth of Clyde where vessels by virtue of their size, draught, speed or proximity to land, hazards and other vessels are unable to manoeuvre freely must be regarded as a 'Narrow Channel'. This also applies in the waters of the Kings Harbour. Clydeport Operations Limited waters are to the south and west and Kings Harbour waters to the north, of a line from Rosneath Point to a point approximately halfway between Craigendoran Pier and Ardmore Head, (Admiralty Chart 1994 refers). Whilst racing, any yacht which is unable for reasons of lack of wind or other cause, to sail clear of a large power-driven vessel shall start her engine and/or paddle in order to clear and thereafter shall report full details to the Race Committee. Competitors are reminded of the Clydeport Operations Limited Byelaw which prohibits yachts and other craft from manoeuvring within 100 metres of any ferry terminal. Particular regard shall be paid to this when in the vicinity of the Caledonian MacBrayne and Western Ferries facilities at Gourock, Dunoon, McInroy's Point and Hunter's Quay.

19 LIABILITY

Rule 3 of the Racing Rules of Sailing states: "The responsibility for a boat's decision to participate in a race or to continue racing is hers alone".

Sailing is by its nature an unpredictable sport and therefore inherently involves an element of risk. By taking part in the event, each competitor agrees and acknowledges that:

- (i) They are aware of the inherent element of risk involved in the sport and accept responsibility for the exposure of themselves, their crew and their boat to such inherent risk whilst taking part in the event:
- (ii) They are responsible for the safety of themselves, their crew, their boat and their other property whether afloat or ashore;
- (iii) They accept responsibility for any injury, damage or loss to the extent caused by their own actions or omissions:
- (iv) Their boat is in good order, equipped to sail in the event and they are fit to participate;
- (v) The provision of a race management team, patrol boats and other officials and volunteers by the organiser does not relieve them of their own responsibilities;
- (vi) The provision of patrol boat cover is limited to such assistance, particularly in extreme weather conditions, as can be practically provided in the circumstances.

20 COMMUNICATIONS

RRS 41 applies. When racing, no voice or data transmissions shall be made or received, except in an emergency.

Competitors are reminded that whilst racing, requesting information on the course or any aspect of the sailing instructions will be considered an infringement of RRS 41.


21 RETIRALS

6 CONDITIONS OF ENTRY FOR THE KING GEORGE V CHALLENGE CUP RACE

- 1) Every competing yacht shall be wholly decked (open cockpits permitted) and be the bona fide property of, and steered by, a Member of a Club affiliated to the Clyde Yacht Clubs' Association.
- 2) In order to qualify for entry into the Cup Race to win the KGV trophy, each yacht must have entered for, competed in and finished at least three races of Royal Gourock Yacht Club during 2021. Qualifying Races are races sailed in May, June, July and August. This condition is waived for yachts owned and steered by a Member of RGYC

The Fantasy Salver will be awarded to the best placed Loch Long OD.

The Green Hackle Trophy will be awarded to the best placed Piper OD.

A trophy will be presented to the best placed Club Piper OD.

The Avon Trophy will be awarded to the best placed Etchells OD.

The Iris Cup will be awarded to the best placed restricted sail handicap boat.

A trophy will be presented to the best placed CYCA handicap boat not eligible to win the KGV Challenge Cup.

1 TIMES & SIGNALS

General Sailing Instructions for Racing at Gourock apply, except as modified hereunder.

A time signal will be made at 09.50

2 START LINE

The Starting Line will be between the Orange Pole at the east side of the Clubhouse and an inflatable outer Mark 'Z' (or z) as indicated in the Standard Course Table. The moveable start mark Z will be laid in position 10 minutes before the first start. If the inflatable start mark Z has not been laid, then mark E (or e) will be deemed to be mark Z (or z) at the start. In addition, the **letter E** will be displayed on the platform to draw attention to the change of start mark.

3 COURSE

Start line. Round Great Cumbrae leaving to either side. The Tan mark to the South West corner of Great Cumbrae to be passed on the correct side. Finish Line.

4 TIME LIMIT

The Fixed Time Limit is 18:00 hrs with an extension of one hour (as per General Sailing Instruction 14).

5 RETIRAL

Any boat retiring must inform the Race Officer by mobile phone or by phoning the club office on 01475 632983

GUIDANCE NOTES FOR RACE OFFICERS

PRELIMINARY

a) Read carefully and understand fully the Sailing Instructions and Course Charts. The Race Management Notice Board should also be checked for any instructions/amendments

b) Arrive in ample time (suggest 18.15) to make all necessary preparations before the first signal.

- c) Please check for shipping movements with both the Kings Harbour Master's office on 01436 674321 ext 3555 and Peelports (ClydePort) Authority on 01475 726221 to establish if there are any movements that may affect course selection. If you are hosting a race that is not published in these Sailing Instructions then you must contact them to advise them of the Event, the Course and Number of competitors to ensure there is no conflict with Shipping Traffic.
- d) Ensure that the duty party is organised, reports in good time, and that each knows their function.
- e) If you think that you may need any temporary marks, please advise the Boatman as soon as possible (Mob. 07710 434 318).

BEFORE THE FIRST SIGNAL

- a) Check that all equipment is arranged and works (NB. there are many signal/course boards so try to find those required early).

 1 The Club Burgee should be hoisted on the Orange Flagpole.

2 The Klaxon is working, and the horn board placed outside.

3 Flags bent on to the gantry in the correct order for hoisting. In the interest of uniformity Flag P should be hoisted next to the orange pole with the Class Signals running in order from left to

right on the gantry

- b) At least 10 minutes before the first start the Boatman will endeavour to lay the sponsored inflatable Start Mark creating a start line at 90 degrees to the wind. Should this not be possible then the letter E must be displayed on the railings at least 10 minutes before the first start to indicate that Race Mark E will be used for the outer end of the start line. If this does not happen within the specified time you must go to a postponement and rectify the problem to conform to the sailing instructions.
- c) Select the course (after taking into account: the wind direction; the weather and forecast; the tide; and, in August and September, the earlier sunset and time limit). Make use of the flexibility allowed with start mark Z to lay a fair start line to match the conditions. Considerable care should be taken in the selection of a suitable course. The two and three lap courses have been planned for two reasons: firstly, to provide maximum interest for the participants; and secondly to allow you to select a longer course with the option to shorten if the wind falls. To allow the launch to be available for passengers, the temporary Mark X may be laid during the late afternoon. Please move or ignore these if conditions have changed. If you select a course using a temporary mark, please check with the boatman that it can be laid or moved in sufficient time.
- d) Display the Course Number and X, Y or Z from the hooks on the railing in front of the gantry. This must be done before the Warning Signal of Race 1 but should if possible be displayed earlier. (NB If the course has been displayed and it is necessary to change it before the start, due to error or weather change, then use a brief Postponement to draw attention to the course
- e) Ensure that the Timekeeper has the correct instructions, that they understands them and adheres strictly to them.
- List the starters in each class, checking them immediately before and after each start.
- g) Ensure you have required boards ready for single (X) or general recalls (First Substitute)

AT THE STARTS

- a) Recall early starters (see RRS29).
- b) Note any late starters and how late.
- c) Apply RRS45 with discretion; e.g. where an advantage is both sought and gained (but not against crews 'running late').

AFTER THE LAST START

- a) Instruct signallers as to correction of times.
- b) Look out for and note any retirals.
- c) Look out for any incidents occurring.
- d) Determine scale of finishing sound signals for each class and ensure that the Timekeeper is aware.
- e) Continually review need to shorten course during Rounds 1 & 2. If you wish to shorten, display Flag "S" for all classes, or Flag "S" plus the appropriate Class Flag for individual classes. Call

attention to the Flag "S" with two sound signals. (NB when a decision has been made, it is normally appropriate to hoist flag "S" shortly after the first yacht commences the leg to the finish)

5 AT THE FINISHES

- a) Call off yachts to the Timekeeper as each crosses the Finishing Line using sail numbers only and try to give advance warning.
- b) Look out for protest flags.
- c) Make sure that the number of finishers plus retirals equals the number of starters so that all starters are accounted for.
- d) Recover temporary Mark X (if laid) as soon as possible (i.e. please advise the Boatman after the last yacht has rounded).

6 AFTER THE LAST FINISH

- a) Examine the corrected time sheets/results for any errors and post a copy of the results on the Notice Board (ensuring a copy is left in the results book).
- b) Ensure that:
 - 1) All equipment is replaced
- 4) Platform door is locked
- 2) All flags are lowered
- 5) All temporary marks have been lifted
- 3) The Klaxon is switched off (NB the clock should not be switched off)
 c) In the event of a protest organise a hearing and, if possible, reach a decision (See RRS Part 5). A supply of protest forms is kept under the Timekeepers desk.

TIMEKEEPER'S INSTRUCTIONS

1 GENERAL RESPONSIBILITIES

In addition to calling the start and finishing times, the Timekeeper's responsibilities include the following:

- a) Monitor the activities of the Race Officer. Ensure all actions/decisions occur at an appropriate time. Be familiar with the Race Officer's Instructions and prompt the Race Officer when any omissions are observed.
- b) Identify and record all starters and retirals.
- c) Perform all calculations and recordings.
- d) The signallers should assist as far as possible in the above, under the supervision of the Timekeeper.

2 DUTIES

- a) Arrive in ample time (suggest 18:15 hrs) to make all necessary preparations before the first signal.
- b) Confirm digital clock is set at the correct time. IF NOT, DO NOT ATTEMPT TO ADJUST, but contact the Watersports Secretary: Colin MacDonald RGYCWatersports@gmail.com after racing.
- c) Check presence of required documents:
 - Time, Flag and Sound Signal sheet
 - Starter and time recording form
 - Handicap calculation forms
 - · Seconds decimal table

3 STARTING PROCEDURE SIGNAL

- a) Rule 26 will apply at all starts. Timekeepers should read and understand the procedure.
- b) Call out clearly 'one minute to sound signal and state flags to be hoisted and lowered'
- c) Call out clearly '30seconds, 20seconds, 10-9-8-7-6-5-4-3-2-1-Sound Signal'

4 POSTPONEMENTS AND GENERAL RECALLS

Postponements shall be called by hoisting 'AP' with two sound signals. Following a postponement agree new start times with the Race Officer. Prepare a new time sequence. The 'AP' is lowered one minute before the next Warning Signal with one sound signal.

GENERAL RECALLS

General Recalls shall be called by hoisting '1st Substitute' with three sound signals. Following a General Recall agree new start times with the Race Officer. Prepare a new time sequence. The '1st Substitute' is lowered one minute before the next Warning Signal with one sound signal.

5 AFTER EACH START

Count the starters to confirm all yachts accounted for. Note premature starters who do not return as 'OCS'.

6 TIME LIMITS

Check the applicable time limit for the race.

7 END OF ROUNDS

Record all end of round times in the order they occur. Rearrange into classes only when posting to the Results Book. It is essential that this procedure is adhered to as most errors and omissions occur as a result of adopting some other system.

8 SCALE OF SOUND SIGNALS

Advise Race Officer of scale of finishing sound signals for each race:

2 Starters - 1 sound signal 4 Starters - 2 sound signals 6 Starters - 3 sound signals 10 Starters - 4 sound signals 15 Starters - 5 sound signals

Inform Timekeeper which boats require sound signals.

9 RECORD BOOK

During the race prepare the handicap calculation forms and the Results Book. Independently checked. Enter places in the Book and circle as per the scale of sound signals.

10 RECORDS

Retain all notes, times, etc., taken. They may be required to confirm the placing of any yacht or as evidence in any Protest or Request for Redress.
